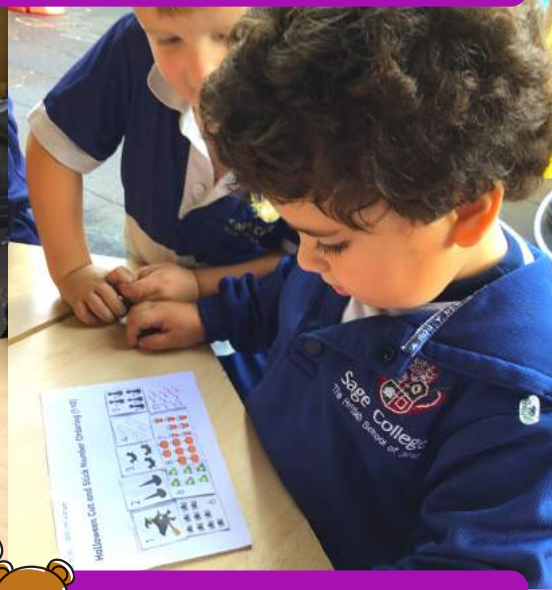
PreNursery

THE 7 WONDERS OF THE WORLD

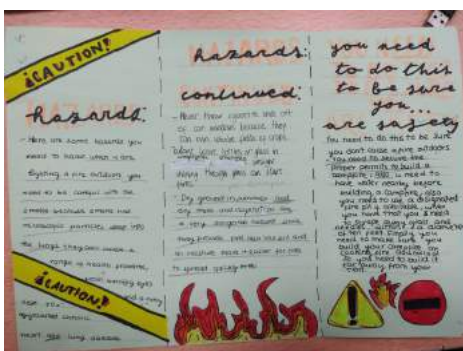
