


NURSERY


This week The Busy Bees, brought their amazing journey in early years to a close with their Graduation Ceremony.

Students and teachers alike enjoyed thrilling rides and attractions --including the Jaguar, the first inverted roller coaster in Spain, or El Desafío, a 68 metre high freefall that recreates an ancient Arab minaret. High temperatures were not a problem, since they had the opportunity to cool off on several water rides, like the log flume (the Anaconda), a splash ride with a drop of 15 m (the Iguazú), and a water rapids attraction (Los Rápidos del Orinoco).
