

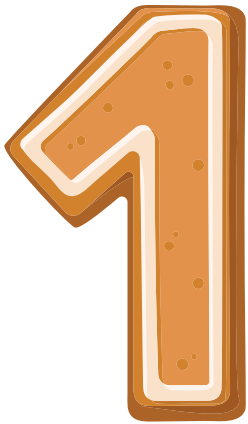

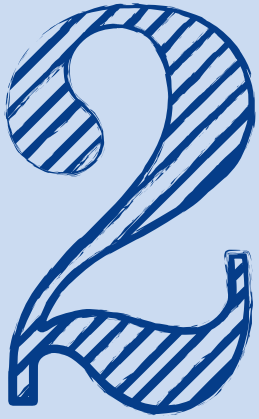

What skills does my child need to start their Pre-Nursery journey?

In Pre Nursery we build skills needed for the next two phases of the Early Years and we work on each child's individual needs and progress.

The first three years of life are a time of rapid cognitive, linguistic, social, emotional and motor development. This is why we focus on the three prime areas: Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Communication and Language, and Physical Development.

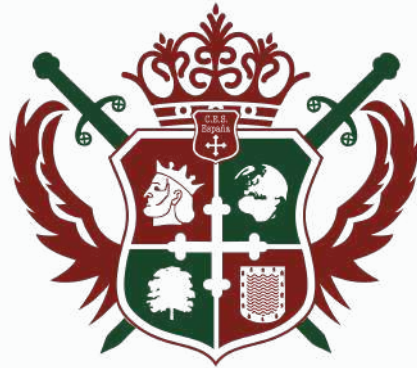
What skills does my child need to start their Nursery journey?

- Be able to communicate needs using gesture or their home language.
- Be out of nappies and able to access the toilet with support from an adult.
- Be able to use a cup independently.

What skills does my child need to start in Reception journey?

- Go to the toilet independently and be able to clean their bottom
- Put on and take off their sweatshirt.
- Clean their teeth.
- Put socks and shoes on independently.
- Taking care of personal belongings.





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
