The day of love



-MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS-

ICT SUBJECT

Year 7 students are currently completing the Module Exploring Documents. In this module learners had to develop their skills using Microsoft Word. They had to create and edit a text document, add images, edit text, refine and organise the layout for a specific audience. In order to achieve this, students are completing a Final Project where they have to write an article describing what healthy eating means and adapt the article to suit two different audiences: Students and Parents.





Year 8 pupils have been completing the Module

Exploring Programming. In this module students have learnt to plan an algorithm to draw simple repeating shapes and then create a program to produce the algorithm.

Students are also learning how to use decomposition to now plan and create complex shapes.

Year 9 students are currently learning about **Networks**. They must understand how routers work and other network devices and also to understand **how to set up and configure a small network** and be able to describe security issues regarding data transfer. Our pupils had a **visit and lesson from David Álvarez, Head of ICT and Operations** at the school. Mr Álvarez manages the school's network and brought network devices for students to view.

DESIGNING HOLIDAYS-COLLABORATIVE LEARNING

The Year 10 Travel and Tourism students have been working in groups to make **brochures on different destinations around the world**: Birmingham, Alabama, Abu Dhabi, Dubai, London, New York City and Bali. This has allowed them to research about some of the different products that a holiday is made of. They have used Canvas to make these brochures, which also helped them develop ICT skills.





Shaping THE FUTURE

Last Friday, our High School students had a **uni talk by Allan Palmer, from Universidad Europea Madrid**. They learnt more about accessing Spanish universities, about Universidad Europea, and the opportunities to have exchange programmes in international universities.
