Experiential Learning in English

Students in Year 8 have been focusing on poetry in their first unit this term and, as part of this, a **poem called 'Still I rise' by Maya Angelou**. In English, students often investigate the social and historical climate of what they are studying in order to develop a further connection to the material, and in this case, **we have been exploring the civil rights movement of the 1960s and especially black segregation**. Whilst students might have had difficulty grasping these concepts of inequality, they certainly didn't after this class!

Students were split into three groups; those wearing glasses, others wearing jumpers and the rest of the class. The students wearing glasses could sit on chairs for the lesson, those wearing jumpers had to sit on the floor and the rest had to stand up. The students felt upset and angry about how unfair this was and were able to empathize, on a very realistic level, with the poet and her sentiments.

SPANISH LITERATURE


Reinforcing reading
