On this occasion, our school Sage College has been externally assessed or audited by means of the NABSS inspection that every British school in Spain must pass and guarantee that it complies with the requirements and quality standards to operate under this name and certification. These past months we could read the "Ranking of the best schools" in some media channels whose veracity is doubtful to say the least, especially because the schools must pay to be positioned in them and they lack objectivity due to the absence of any inspection.

On the 17th March we were audited by NABSS (NIS/British Council) and it is a pleasure for me to share with the whole Sage College community that the result was excellent. We were given the highest score and we can say that we are among the best British schools in Spain. A special mention must go to our pupils, teachers and above all to the leadership team who have spent many months preparing for this inspection. 
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Year 8 and Year 9: Quelle est ton activité préférée?
